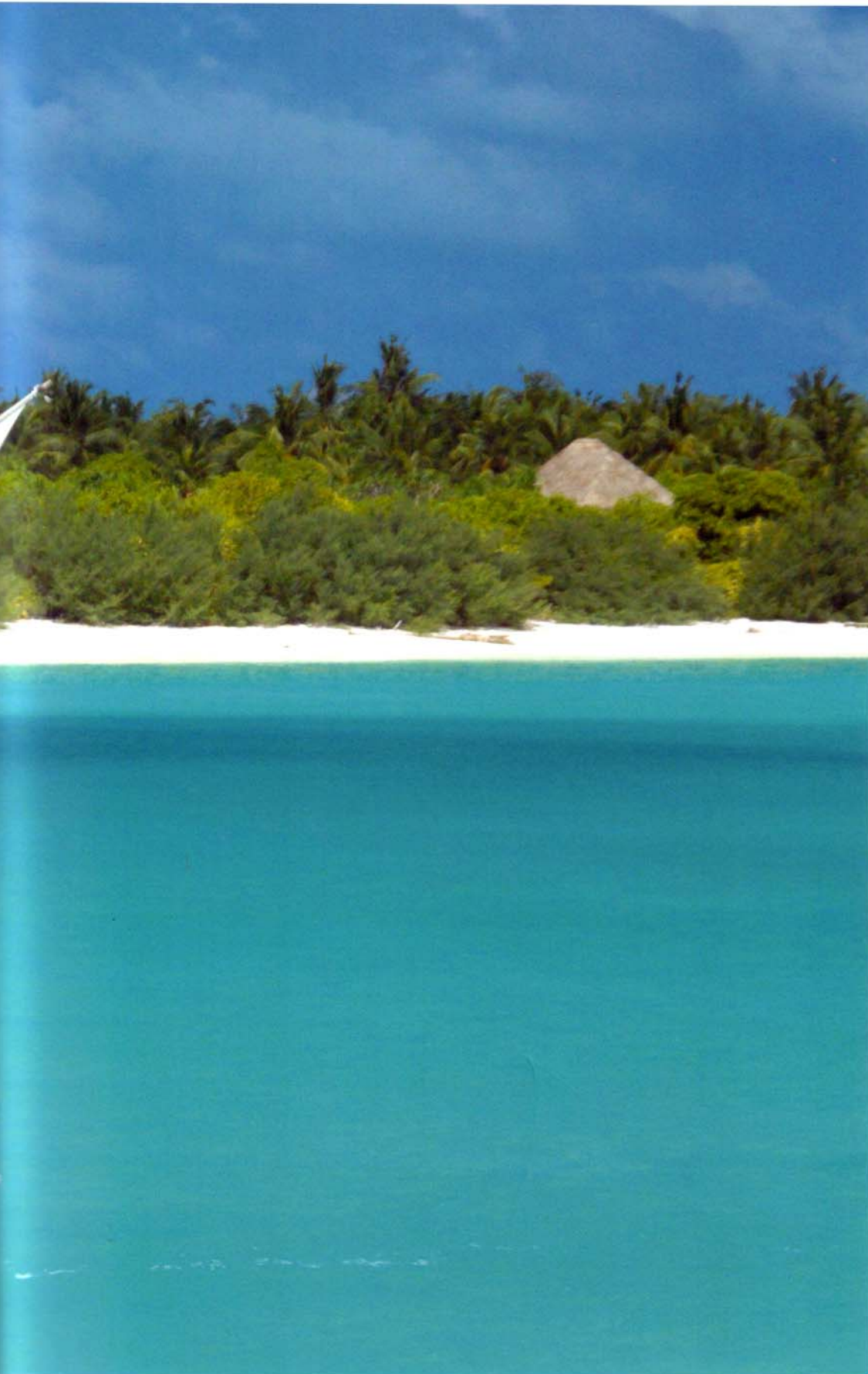




island hideaway | the maldives





Previously uninhabited, the only thing that has been constructed on this half moon shaped island in the North of the Maldives is a small luxury hotel. The island has not been developed further – making the term ‘Hideaway’ extremely apt. Guests have this magnificent paradise to themselves.

There are 43 villas available. Guests who want to be over the water can choose to stay in one of the spa-water-villas with their own sauna, steam bath and Jacuzzi. Almost twice as large as these villas, The ‘Dhonakulhi Residences’ come with a garden and living area totalling over 550 square metres and their own private section of beach.

Guests can upgrade to a 700 square metre ‘Jasmine Garden Villa’ and if that is not enough, the ‘Hideaway Palace’ provides the ultimate experience. This 1,420 square metre private estate guarantees its guests undisturbed peace and relaxation.

Both the architecture and the cuisine are a blend of Maldivian, Asian and international influences. The chefs are available around the clock, leaving the guest to decide only when, where and what to eat. Like everywhere in The Maldives, a large portion of daily life takes place below the surface of the water.

The ‘Dhoni’ departs several times a day to a number of virtually untouched diving sites in the area. Guests will get their first opportunity to case out their own piece of paradise during the half hour flight from Male. Having settled in, they can head out by boat to claim that uninhabited island for that ‘Robinson Crusoe’ experience.
